# ENGINEERING STAFF REPORT (as of May 11, 2022)

#### **CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS**

- a. Secondary Clarifier No. 3 Rehabilitation Project (Contractor: TNT Industrial)
  - Late season cold weather storms have delayed replacement of grout layer
    - Currently scheduled for May 19 weather pending
- b. Rocky 1 Waterline Replacement Project (Contractor: Haen)
  - Liberty connected power drop at Price Road Pressure Reducing Valve (PRV) on May 7
    - Ready to test station
  - Work has commenced at Susquehana PRV
    - Shut down entire zone (150+ customers) for intertie on May 12
- c. Keller Heavenly Phases 1 and 2 Project (Contractor: White Rock)
  - Staff is working to reschedule concrete core of foundation and anchor bolt pull test
  - Work has resumed to tie in new PRV and waterline
    - Shut down will affect 90-100 customers on May 12
  - Decommissioning old PRV on May 13
    - Small shut-down required
- d. Blower Generator, Secondary Clarifiers No.'s 1 & 2, and Tank Backup Power (Contractor: Vinciguerra))
  - Blower Generator commissioning and load bank testing was conducted May 4 and 5
  - Tank backup battery submittal has been approved
    - Ordering can proceed
  - Staff is waiting for contractor to provide updated project schedule for clarifiers
- e. Tahoe Keys Pump Station Rehabilitation Project (Contractor: T&S Construction)
  - Conditional approval of Project permit received from TRPA on May 7
  - Delivery of electrical trailer delayed until November
    - Pushing Project into 2023

- f. Paloma Well Rehabilitation Project (Contractor: Zim Industries)
  - Staff is waiting for contractor to provide updated Project schedule
- g. Bowers & Bijou 2/3 Waterline Replacement Projects (Contractor: Vinciguerra)
  - Contractor has been working to secure Builder's Risk insurance prior to mobilization

### **PLANNING/DESIGN**

- a. Groundwater Management Planning
  - Groundwater Management Plan (GWMP) Update
    - El Dorado Water Agency adopted Resolution and Plan at public hearing on April 13
    - Board adopted Resolution and held public hearing on April 21
- b. Keller-Heavenly Phase 3 Project (Consultant: Farr West)
  - Project advertised for bid on April 21
    - Mandatory pre-bid meeting held May 5 with six general contractors attending
    - Bid opening scheduled for June 7
- c. Al Tahoe/Bayview Backup Power & Well Rehabilitation Project (Consultant: Kennedy Jenks)
  - Project kickoff meeting held April 21
    - Al Tahoe well tested May 12
- d. Bijou Pump Station Project (Consultant: WSC)
  - Board approved Task Order with WSC on May 5
  - Project kickoff meeting held May 10
  - Staff is working with Carollo to model force main hydraulics to support pump selection
- e. Luther Pass Tanks Rehabilitation Project (Consultant: Bayez and Patel)
  - Staff working with consultant to prepare scope and budget for plans and technical specifications for the Tank 1 Rehabilitation
    - Staff expects to bring the Proposal to the Board for consideration on June 2
- f. Bijou 1 Waterline Replacement Project (NCE)
  - Staff is bringing a Task Order for design services to Board on May 19
- a. Future Waterlines
  - Staff will be completing design of Black Bart Waterline Project for bidding in August
  - Staff will continue design of Herbert Walkup and Pioneer Trail for 2024 construction
  - Staff will bring Notice of Exception for waterline projects to Board on May 19
  - Staff is planning to survey waterlines off Lake Tahoe Blvd and Glenwood/Rancho this summer so designs can proceed this winter
- h. Future Sewerlines
  - Staff is finalizing a recommendation for a Cured-In-Place Pipe (CIPP)
     Rehabilitation Project in the Keys in 2024

- i. Water System Asset Management Projects
  - Water Station Electrical Condition Assessments (Consultant: WSC/HDR)
    - ERS begins electrical testing on May 16 through June 10 in coordination with Liberty
- j. Sewer System Asset Management Projects
  - WWTP Condition Assessment (Consultant: Water Systems Consultants
    - Electrical testing to commence in May (see Water Station Electrical Condition Assessments above)
  - Sewer Station Electrical Condition Assessments: See Water Station Electrical Condition Assessments (above)

## **OTHER**

- a. Luther Pass Pump Replacements
  - Staff is preparing to level pump bases
    - Starting with Pump 1
- b. Tahoe Keys Emergency Supply (Consultant: Carollo)
  - First draft of Tasks 1 and 2 report received from consultant on March 27
  - Initial round of comments from staff will go back to consultant to address before distributing to TKPOA for further comment
  - Expect revised draft of report to be available in early May
- c. Community Project Support and Interagency Coordination
  - City's Tahoe Valley Project is bidding, but will need revision to address conflicts with STPUD facilities
  - Staff met with City and Southwest (SW) Gas on April 26 to coordinate Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Projects
  - Staff met with County and SW Gas on April 27 to coordinate CIP Projects
  - Staff meeting with United States Forest Service (USFS) on May 24 to introduce District staff and projects to USFS Team
  - Staff participated in a panel discussion regarding Caldor Fire at Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) on May 5 with good results
  - Staff will attend North Tahoe Public Utility District (NTPUD) "All Hands" meeting on May 26 to discuss Caldor Fire
- d. WWTP Solar Project
  - Staff has returned questions to solar teams and will prepare responses for next Ad-Hoc committee meeting on May 19
- e. Engineering Staffing
  - Water Resources Manager
    - Selected candidate backed out
    - Recruitment is restarting
  - Engineering Intern
    - Recruitment is continuing
    - Offers have been made
  - Construction Materials Engineers, Inc., (CME) Inspector joined staff for the summer on May 9
